"No man/woman is an island," John Donne, a 15th century poet, wrote in one of his poems. None of us live in isolation. We all are part of a bigger unit. We all are interconnected with others through families, neighbourhoods, workplaces, church, or school and in a million other ways. Ultimately each of us belongs to the greater whole that is humanity itself.

Congregation Communication - Cathy Calvin, Chairperson Trinity Board of Directors

On Friday May 26th we met with Emblem, the company that is building the three towers adjacent to our church. Emblem gave us notice that construction will begin around July 1, 2023. As of July 1st, we will no longer have use of the parking lot for Sunday mornings and events taking place during the week.

We do have a parking plan in place, however. The parking lot (at Hooper Law) has been severed and now belongs to the Spice Factory. The Spice Factory parking lot is located across the street from their building. We have approached the Spice Factory and they have given us permission to park in their lot on Sunday mornings and Thursday nights for choir. They are giving this to us free of charge which we appreciate very much! If there is an instance where we cannot use this lot on either day, they will give us plenty of notice so we can notify the congregation. You can use this lot right away and many have been using it all along!

Additionally, we can set up a list and be charged monthly from IMPARK, who manages the lot across Wilson Street at the corner of Hughson Street. This would be for Sunday mornings only. If you wish to park in this lot, you will need to call the office (905) 974-9878 and give your name, make and model of your vehicle, and your license plate number to Carol-Ann. This needs to be done by June 23, 2023 so we can get the list to IMPARK. You will then be able to park there beginning Sunday, July 2nd, without paying. Your license plate will be on file with IMPARK so you will not be ticketed by the bylaw officer.

Of course we still have three accessible parking spaces on Hughson Street which are available until they start the building construction on that side of Hughson. At that point the sidewalk will be closed. Please note that we anticipate only having to do this until January or February 2024 as we

are hoping that our own renovations will be starting. We will move up to the Fennell site while our renovations are being done.

Please remember to join us in person on **Sunday, June 4th** to say goodbye and Godspeed to Pastor Loretta.

This will be Pastor Loretta's last service with us before her retirement.

Communication Interview with Carol-Ann Koevoets

Communication... essential to human society. We communicate in many ways with spoken language, with the written word, with sign language, with devices, with visuals and with non-verbal signals and gestures.

Effective communication is an integral part of a good relationship be it at work, within our families, in organizations or with the outside world. So naturally it follows that this effective communication is essential within the fellowship of a church as well.

Carol-Ann Koevoets, our church Office Administrator, is at the heart of Trinity's communication hub. I asked her to share some of her thoughts and experience about this important topic with the following questions:

Emma: As someone who is communicating in various ways all day long in your job, can you describe what effective communication looks like?

Carol-Ann: It is important to be clear and specific. Say what you mean in a courteous way. Consider the individual you are communicating with and what their unique needs might be as that can affect how you might respond to them.

Emma: What are some ways that we can improve our communication skills here at Trinity Lutheran Church?

Carol-Ann: Trinity is a very busy church. We have dedicated volunteers serving on many different committees. As the Office-Administrator it is my job to know what activities are going on, when and where. That way, when anyone asks me, I can give them an accurate answer. Having up to date information also helps to prevent double booking and inevitably any disappointments. I can be more efficient in my role if each committee has one person who follows up consistently with me. A quick email at the end of all committee meetings to notify me of any upcoming events, including details, would help me greatly.

To the congregation at large, I would encourage members to communicate with me if they need support, whether it is a prayer request or a need for pastoral care or an important family announcement. Your personal calls are always kept confidential. We want to support you but we cannot be there for you unless you let us know when there is a need.

A successful church website consists of a blend of effective design along with relevant, interesting, and engaging content to attract visitors. Accessibility and a responsive design are equally important aspects of any website.

Last year the decision was made to update Trinity's website. Trinity's goal is to maximize their website's potential to support their mission and ministry while creating an engaging visitor experience. It is important to capture the spirit of Trinity along with providing compelling content and information. Often new and potential members form their opinions of an organization based on their experience using their website. Not only is relevant content important but emotions and experience play a big part in the success of a website. Trinity's goal is to make the website user experience a great one for everyone using it. Radiating the essence of what Trinity is all about will inspire newcomers to want to be a part of Trinity as well as improving the experience for current members.

The website is being redesigned to include content and images about Trinity's groups, social ministry, events, worship, publications, team members, and Trinity's vision, mission, and core values. The goal is to have the content easily accessible and informative. The redesign not only includes a new look and new navigation, but it is also web accessible with a responsive design.

Many people have heard about web accessibility and responsive design but aren't really sure how that impacts a website. The Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) is a law that sets out accessibility standards for businesses and organizations in Ontario. The aim of AODA is to make Ontario more accessible and inclusive for people with disabilities. Web accessibility is included in AODA along with several other standards. These standards apply in varying ways to organizations depending on the number of employees they have. While Trinity is a small organization and is not required by law to meet the web accessibility standards, creating an accessible website is always the right thing to do. Web accessibility promotes inclusion and awareness and improves the experience for everyone.

Web accessibility means that websites, tools, and technologies are designed and developed so that people with disabilities can use them. The truth is that web accessibility benefits everyone, not just those with disabilities. A few examples of accessibility features are large font sizes, optimal contrast, clear navigation, and the website is operable with the use of a keyboard only.

Responsive design displays differently to accommodate various screen sizes, reflowing to fit nicely onto your desktop computer, laptop, tablet, and mobile phone.

The finishing touching are being completed on the website. An announcement will be made once it is up and running this summer. At that time we will ask for any questions and feedback that you may have to share.

The GFB had operated out of Faith and Grace prior to our amalgamation. Trinity identified this program as important in addressing food insecurity and continued it after amalgamation. Thank you to Gail Bennie, who coordinated the King Street site, and to Pastor Loretta, who coordinated the Hughson Street and Fennell sites. Gail retired in June 2022. Pastor Loretta and volunteers have been filling approximately 140 boxes a month. 80 of the boxes are for people supported by the Hamilton Social Work Action Group. We thank both Gail and Pastor Loretta, as well as all the many volunteers for their support and dedication.

We are looking for a new coordinator in hopes to continue the program once Pastor Loretta retires in June. The program runs from September to June, on the second Thursday of each month. The position requires 15 hours of time per month. This includes committing to the full day on the GFB pick-up day, as well as preparation time during the month. An honorarium is being offered for the role of coordinator.
