Update from the Call Committee

Greetings from the Call Committee! We want to introduce ourselves and update the members of Trinity on steps we have taken in the process to find our new pastor. While it is a confidential process, until a recommendation is made to the Board and the congregation votes, it is important that the members of Trinity are aware of the work going on "behind the scenes".

Our dedicated committee includes Barbara Alken (Chair), Cathy Calvin, Janet Weingartner, Jim Ridge, and Stanley Moyo. Pastor Dani is also taking part as she will be working closely with our new pastor.

The Call Committee has met multiple times and we have met twice with Pastor Doug Reble, Assistant to the Bishop. A small working group from the Board prepared the Congregational Mission Profile. This extensive document gives potential candidates an overview of who we are and what our mission in Hamilton is all about.

The pastor position at Trinity has been listed in the *Eastern Synod Weekly* magazine since the fall of 2023. This prompted interested pastors to contact the Synod office to enquire about the opening. In the end, we asked four pastors to submit their Availability for Call (AFC) forms to us. This gives us comparable information about who they are, where they have been, and what is important to them in their ministry. One pastor declined and we ended up receiving five AFC forms in total.

We carefully reviewed all five forms and, after a lot of discussion, have decided to interview two excellent candidates. We created a list of interview questions designed to find out if the pastors share our vision and mission and if they will be a good match for Trinity. The interviews will be taking place shortly, which will give us more information to consider and discuss.

The Call Committee is very grateful for the support of the Synod office and their availability to answer all questions. We ask our fellow members of Trinity to include this work in their prayers as we continue the process.

Creation Care Group- Virtual Walk Around the World By Skha Mpofu-Moyo and Stanley Moyo

In 2021 we embarked on a virtual walk around the world to raise awareness about climate change and the environment. Our hope in doing this grand project is to stimulate discussion about environmental problems and to demonstrate that individuals are not helpless and can do something about the deterioration. We estimate that our virtual walk will take at least 12 years.

The graphic shows that we have walked 6,974 kms after two years of walking, from July 2021 to December 2023. We have completed 17% of the distance around the Earth. We are proud of this achievement especially when it stimulates conversations about climate change.

An unexpected benefit of the walk is that we are healthier than we would have otherwise been. Mother Earth truly gives back to us when we play our role in making it a better place to live. We are feeling much stronger now than we were before we embarked on this project. We all can play our part and together we can make a change.

The flowing water of the Desjardins Canal tends to keep


the water ice-free there, attracting a variety of waterfowl. If we're lucky, one of our resident bald eagles will fly by.

Thank you for your donations

Trinity members are generous with their support to our community! Since September, \$2558 along with food items have been donated for Community Fridges Hamilton.

Thanks to the knitting and crocheting volunteers for all of their contributions. The Out of the Cold program has taken items that they require; 1 large bag was donated to the Venture Centre; baby items were donated to Public Health, Nurse-Family Partnership; 58 mittens/ gloves, 8 scarves, 4 pairs of socks and 10 hats were donated to Cathy Weaver, Dr. Davey, and Parkdale schools.

Winter Apparel Drive items are being given to people attending the Out of the Cold and our People's Cafe. Prior to Christmas, \$1035 in Gift Cards were donated to Liberty for Youth and Living Rock.

Through our Good Food Box (GFB) program we provide produce to the Native Women's Centre, Neighbour to Neighbour and St. Mathew's House. We support the Hamilton Social Work Action Committee in their goal to address food insecurity for low income single people in our community. The Social Work Action Committee purchased 85 boxes. Trinity volunteers fill about 130 boxes each month. Subsidies for GFB are also available through Trinity. Any GFB not picked up are donated to Living Rock for their food bank. Thank you to the Lutheran Ladies United who provide soup to people picking up their GFB at Hughson St.
