In many photos of my childhood, I often had band aids on my elbows and knees. I still remember the burn when my mother sprinkled iodine on the little wounds to make sure they wouldn't get infected.

I guess it took me some time to realize that we humans are vulnerable creatures. Our thin skin is only millimeters thick and if we hurt ourselves, we can bleed easily. I had to learn over time to be careful not to drive my bike too fast, climb up all the way to the top of the trees, and to pay attention when picking blackberries.

Not only are humans vulnerable, but all creatures. We all have a limited life span, as the bible says. We lived through the pandemic and saw how a tiny virus could turn our world upside down. Congregational Communication - By Cathy Calvin, Chair, Trinity Board of Directors

On March 10, 2024, a Congregational meeting was held to discuss Invizij Architect's Feasibility Study results regarding our property at 104 Hughson St. N. A motion was made to approve the design concept in principle, which was adopted by the congregation. A second motion was made to approve that we continue to use Invizij architects to take us to the completion of the project, which was also approved. The Redevelopment Working Group is now reviewing the contract that Invizij provided us with. We will see what the results are with the meeting at City Hall and with our lawyer before we sign it over. We will also be working with Invizij on the actual design details of the project so we can bring a budget amount to the congregation in the coming months.



At our Annual General Meeting (AGM) in February, we announced that the Call Committee recommended Pastor Jordan Smith for a call at Trinity Lutheran Church, which the board and the congregation whole-heartily approved. Pastor Smith has now accepted the call to Trinity and his first day will be Tuesday May 21, 2024. His first Sunday with us will be May 26 and we will welcome him and his family on that day. He will be commuting for a while until his family moves sometime in August. Please plan to be at church that day to welcome Pastor Jordan!

Finally, the Ontario Government has made changes to the Incorporations Act which we now have to incorporate into our Constitution and Bylaws. We need to have this done by October 2024. The changes have been made and now as a congregation we need to vote on them to make them legal.

Electronic copies of the revised Constitution will be going out to those with email on April 8th. There will be paper copies available in the Narthex the following Sunday, April 14th for those who want to see the changes and have no email. The official Congregational Meeting to vote on the changes is set to be held on Sunday, May 19th. As a matter of rule, we must give the congregation 30 days to look at the changes and to formulate questions which will be answered at the meeting. Look for this revised constitution and a further explanation on May 8th.

Earth Day by Pastor Thomas Mertz

On Monday April 22 Earth Day will be commemorated in over 175 countries. The annual event is intended to strengthen appreciation for our natural environment but also to encourage us to rethink our consumer behavior.

Earth Day draws our attention to the growing problem of plastic waste and calls us to reduce our use of plastic. Microplastics can already be found in the Arctic ice as well as in the human food chain. Every day, more plastic waste ends up in nature, rivers, and oceans.

In 2019 the <u>British newspaper "The Guardian"</u> estimated that around 8.3 billion tons of plastic have been produced on Earth to date - the equivalent of 800,000 Eiffel Towers!

Much plastic waste ends up in the oceans. Packaging makes up most of it. Only nine percent of this waste is recycled so far. Plastic is becoming a huge problem.

Plastic pollution is a problem because of its long-lasting effects as it is petroleum-based, man-made material that never fully degrades. One plastic bottle takes a minimum of 450 years to decompose!

That is reason enough for the organizers of the annual Earth Day to dedicate this year's action day to the fight against plastic waste. "Plastic pollution is an omnipresent challenge today. We see plastic floating in our rivers, oceans, and bays, polluting landscapes and affecting the health of us and our children," said Valeria Merino from the Earth Day network. "We have all contributed - mostly unknowingly - and must now help to reduce and end plastic pollution."

The focus on this year's Earth Day is "Planet versus Plastics". Plastic is convenient and durable but that is also the problem. We use way too much of it and it doesn't break down easily. We find it everywhere. While it is hard to avoid all use of plastic, one easy way to reduce the amount of plastic is to change to laundry detergents that come in cardboard boxes and are environmentally friendly. I have used them for years and they work well. You can view a list of <u>plastic free laundry detergents</u>, on the <u>I'm</u> <u>Plastic Free</u> website.

You can try them out as I will leave the laundry soap strips in a paper bag in the narthex of the church. Let's reduce our plastic garbage, one bottle at a time.

- 1. To order a taxi call Hamilton Cab at **905-777-777.**
- Press "0" to speak to an Operator and order the taxi. If you use the App, it will not go on Trinity's account, and you will have to pay for it.
- 3. Say that you would like to order a taxi on the account of Trinity Lutheran Church for one of the following addresses:
 - 104 Hughson St. N
 - 232 Fennell Ave E
- 4. Confirm with the driver that this is on the account.
- 5. Ask for a receipt with the fare amount on it. Give the receipt to one of the pastors, LLU members, or bring to the church office.
- 6. You can give them a tip if you wish especially if they help you with a walker, etc.
- 7. You can use a taxi to go to any of the Trinity sites any day of the week.
- 8. Make sure you are ready to go before you order the taxi as they can be there within minutes.
